About the Poster

This peek-a-boo poster is designed with 100 lift-the-flap doors. The inside of each door reads numbers 1-100. On every fifth and tenth door, the number has been placed inside a star (so you can easily skip-count by 5s or 10s). Inside each door is a read-aloud riddle. The answers to each riddle are on the teacher key. The numbered doors are arranged in a left-to-right, top-to-bottom grid fashion to support horizontal and vertical tracking skills children use when reading text.

Ideas for Use

- You can use your poster in a multitude of ways.
- Have children take turns opening one door a day as you count your way to the 100th Day of School.
 - Have children take turns opening 10 doors on each of the last 10 days before the 100th Day of School.
 - Open a random number of doors in random order. (Have children guess what number comes before or after or between doors that are already open).
 - Invite children to open doors as an incentive or reward throughout the year.

Using the Riddle Reproducible

Make multiple copies of the Riddle Reproducible on page 2 of this guide. This page is a place for children to record each riddle and its answer as you share it. As children fill a page with riddles, offer them another page to fill. Staple each expanding set of riddles together and place each set of completed pages together in a folder. The blank boxes next to each riddle allow children to number each riddle to correspond to the numbers on the poster. If desired, children can use additional pages to record any favorite riddles they collect from books or those they make up.
