“Hard Working” Worker Ants Relay

Here is a fun game to play at your 100th Day of School Celebration. Use your Stickers to reward winners. (And, of course, they are all winners!)

1. Choose a place to play where you will have plenty of room to spread out.
2. Divide your class up into teams of 5 or 6 students.
3. Choose one student on each team to serve as the Lead Worker Ant.
4. Have remaining Worker Ant students on each team line up and sit cross-legged behind their team’s Lead Worker Ant.
5. Offer each Lead Ant an object to hold, such as a ball or a beanbag.
6. Tell students that the objects represent crumbs of food the Ants need to move.
7. Play music for 100 seconds as the Lead Ants pass the crumbs overhead to the Worker Ants situated directly behind them.
8. Worker Ants continue passing the crumbs overhead to Ants behind until the music stops.

9. When the crumb reaches the last student in line, that student runs to the front of the line, sits down, becomes the Lead Ant and continues passing the object back as before.
10. When the music stops, the Ants holding the crumbs are eliminated, but each receives a sticker for being so “hard working.”
11. Play continues until only one Ant from each team is left. Those remaining Ants then receive their 100th Day Hard Worker Stickers.

100 Second Relay Challenge

1. Challenge small groups of students to take turns performing tasks for the duration of 100 seconds each, such as:
 - stand (or sit) still for 100 seconds
 - crawl like an ant for 100 seconds
 - balance on one foot for 100 seconds (switch feet every 20 seconds)
 - sing the ABC song for 100 seconds
 - keep eyes closed for 100 seconds
 - hum the birthday song for 100 seconds
 - be silent for 100 seconds.
2. Invite other students to count the seconds aloud (or watch the second hand of the clock silently as the time passes).

100 Fun Ant Facts

1. Talk with students about insects known as ants and why ants are considered to be so hard-working. (They can carry about 20 times their own weight.)
2. Challenge students to research and list 100 facts about the hard-working ant.
3. Have students list these on a piece of chart paper. (You can have children collect these facts over time.)
4. Have students make a companion list of ways they work hard at home and in school. (In preparation for creating this list, guide children to understand that they can use their bodies and/or their minds to work hard.)
5. Have students number both lists from 1 to 100.
